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## Welcome to the Historic Straits of Mackinac

For thousands of years the First Nations people, the French, the British, and the American settlers have called the Straits of Mackinac Area home. A friendly and comfortable place with easy access from every direction, the communities of Mackinac have been thriving for a very long time. First came the Anishinaabek tribes, called Odawa south of the Straits and Ojibway or Chippewa to the north. These earliest settlers around Mackinac enjoyed abundant natural resources in the waters and the woodlands of the area. They lived together peacefully in a complex society based on religion, science, art and government that emphasized a love for and a reverence for the lands they called home. This relative harmony was destined to change with the arrival of the first Europeans.

## **DISCOVER THE PROSPECTOR IN YOU**

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Father Jacques Marquette established a mission at St. Ignace in 1671. The French fur traders and military were soon to follow, and life in the Straits would be forever changed. Trading in goods, particularly furs for european products, changed the Straits Area economy from subsistence into capitalism. The British, wanting their piece of this lucrative trade pipeline,

arrived about 100 years later. Expansion and capitalism were well known to the French and English but the Native culture was to be seriously altered.

Forts and trading communities were built, and Jesuit Mission Centers established. All this modern activity, for the time, was really just a continuation of the European expansion through North America. Commerce with the local Indian people was now the order of the day. So, then alliances were established and business was flourishing throughout the Great Lakes. The Straits of Mackinac remain the Crossroads of the Great Lakes and we appreciate this time you can spend with us.





Nature abounds and our rich history is celebrated with great care and hospitality! The Mackinac State Historic Parks offer a very excellent visitor experience. Mackinaw's Heritage Village and the McGulpin Point Lighthouse property, in Mackinaw City, are popular and admission is free. The Museum of Ojibway Culture and Fort de Buade Museum in St. Ignace explain the Native American experience and first contact with the European's, also with free admission. The Icebreaker Mackinaw Museum Ship has a very nice tour and be sure to check out the Jack Pine Lumberjack Shows. There is alot of fun stuff to see and do here, please enjoy your visit!

## The Mighty Mac . . .

## FIVE MILE LONG SUSPENSION BRIDGE LINKING MICHIGAN'S TWO PENINSULAS BETWEEN LAKES MICHIGAN AND HURON AT THE STRAITS OF MACKINAC


Construction began in the spring of 1954 and the bridge opened to traffic November 1, 1957. The Mackinac Bridge remains one of the greatest construction and engineering marvels the world has ever seen. "Mighty Mac" was named the number one civil engineering project for Michigan of the 20th Century. This designation by the Michigan Section of the American Society of Engineers is a fitting testimony to the hard work and dedication of many people.

Dreamed of in the 1800's and seriously studied as early as the 1930's, "Mighty Mac" was finally built through much debate and persuasion of many who said it could not – or should not – be done. Issues of money, taxes and whether a bridge of this magnitude could even stand up were finally overcome



with time, reasoning, and new construction techniques. The Mackinac Bridge stands tall and majestic in the storied Straits of Mackinac. This link between our two peninsulas is a very unique and unifying project with enormous benefits to us all.





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

The Mackinac Straits are rich in maritime history, and a famous group of lighthouses stand watch all the way through. The Straits can be a dangerous place for ships to navigate, with many shoals and shallows that developed when the glaciers receded, about 10,000 years ago. Lakes Michigan and Huron are joined at the turbulent Straits of Mackinac, where many a ship has been lost. The State of Michigan has more shoreline than all the other states except Alaska. This is a big reason that our state is so popular for travel and tourism. Michigan can boast more lighthouses than any other state, with New York coming in second and California third. The Mackinac Straits has 22 lighthouses and the tours and viewing opportunities are fun and easy! You can either: walk, bike, take a boat or a short drive in your car, for a close up view of these beautiful and storied places. Your journey should begin at the Great Lakes Lighthouse Keepers Association and Shepler's Mackinac Island Ferry. They are, both, a wealth of information on everything to do with lighthouses and where you can find them.

A short drive or a leisurely walk will take you along our historic waterfront and popular shopping, dining and entertainment places! The Straits of Mackinac, Mackinaw City and Colonial Michilimackinac have been at thie "Crossroads Of the Great Lakes" for hundreds of years. A tour of our public parks is a great way to start.

Initiate this memorable tour at Conkling Heritage Park, named for our towns founder, Edgar Conkling. This is where the fun begins in Mackinaw City, with ample green space, a band shell and stage, which is home to Mucis in Mackinaw - hosting free concerts and other entertainment through the summer months. Conkling Park is also the site of two premiere Arts and Crafts shows, car shows, a farmer's market, and the annual Rendevous in Mackinaw. Here is the best place to view our Summertime Friday and Sunday fireworks shows and the colossal display every Fourth Of July! Not to be missed, you can visit the U.S.C.G. Icebreaker Museum Ship Mackinaw and the historic armed sloop, Welcome, fully restored.

From here, proceed along the water by Wawatam Park, Gary B. Williams Park, nancy Campbell Park and Alexander Henry Park, where you have reached the very top of the mitten in Michigan. The views along this pathway of the Straits of Mackinac, the Mackinac Bridge, Mackinac Island and Michigan's Upper Peninsula are spectacular! (con't page 13)

Stroll down to the beach and to your left you will see the beautifully restored Old mackinac point Lighthouse. Then enter the grounds of Colonial Michilimackinac with its fully restored fort and community within. Home to one of the longest running archeological digs in the U.S., history is alive with re-enactments and special events. You can even fire the cannon off. with some restrictions. Spend time here. It is well worth the visit!

What next? Spend time in our friendly, historical city for some shopping, dining and fun entertainment. There is much fun to be had at the Mackinaw Crassings, the haunted House, Mystery Town USA, the Mackinaw Bridge Museum (above Mama Mia's Pizza) and Pharoh's Entertainment Center. There is also the Jack Pine Lumberjack shows which is Trip Advisor's #1 attraction in Mackinaw City and is highly recommended.



The Cheboygan area has a diverse history where the Inland Waterway meets the Straits of mackinac. Cheboygan is a Native name meaning "through passage", which refers to the Cheboygan River and Northern Michigan's Inland Waterway. This was the traditional boundary line between the Odawa and Chippewa Indian tribes, long before the first Europeans arrived. This unique waterway system connects Lake Huron with 40 miles of lakes and rivers, passing through some quaint villages along the way. There is something for everyone to enjoy on this journey where the leisure and recreational activities are endless!




Cheboygan is known as a town for the arts and outdoor recreation. A short drive or a hike around town will include stunning waterfront views, lighthouses, fine architecture and art installations, including a sculpture park and beautiful mural paintins all around. Cheboygan is home to the historic Cheboygan Opera House called Northern Michigan's Cultural Diamond, and home port of the famous US Coast Guard Icebraker, Mackinaw.


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Any tour here should begin at the north end of Main Street at Gordon Turner Park. See where the Cheboygan River meets the Straits of Mackinac beside the Cheboygan Crib Lighthouse. Across from the Cheboygan County Marina is the Mackinaw's home, and one block up river is the Riverfront Fange Lighthouse, fully restored and open to the public on weekends and holidays, Memorial Day through Labor Day.

One more block up is the Ottawa Sculpture Park and Downtown Cheboygan, with much to do; shopping, dining and entertainment. Parades are enjoyed every year on St. Patrick's Day, the Fourth of July, Halloween, and around Christmas time. Festival Square hosts numerous fun events and a Farmer's Market, the historic Opera House and a pathway leading to the pituresque river front.





Keep moving up river and you will find the Cheboygan River lock System and the Lincoln Street Bridge. Crossing over here, you will see a statue of the art boat launch as, of course, boating and fishing in the Cheboygan area are very popular sports. To the right are the Cheboygan County Fairgrounds, home to one of Michigan's finest and oldest fairs. The fair takes place around the first two weeks of August each year.

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## INTERNATIONAL Dark Sky Park



#### **HEADS UP IN MACKINAW CITY**

By day or by night this Emmet County Park is a real gem. Located 3 miles west of Mackinaw City, the Headlands International Dark Sky Park is open all day and all night. This awesome public land is situated amongst 600 acres of Northern Michigan forest along two miles of unspoiled Lake Michigan shoreline. Five miles of nature trails run through this wilderness habitat, that's home to a wide variety of native plant and animal species.

Right next door to Headlands is McGulpin Point Lighthouse and Historic Site. Emmet County has restored this former sentinel of the Straits and tours are free to the public. A new Discovery Trail leading down to the lakeshore interprets the history of this important Mackinac Area property.

In 2011, the Headlands was prestigiously named an International Dark Sky Park. This rare designation, only 60 exist in the world with Headlands being the 9th such place, awards protection of the wonderous night sky. With exceptional starry skies and nocturnal habitat, where light pollution is reduced, the natural darkness is a valuable educational, cultural, and scientific resource. Admittance to the park is free, though occasional parking and special program fees may apply. www.MIDarkSkyPark.org

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## Visit the Historic Heritage Village



In partnership with the Village of Mackinaw City, the Mackinaw Area Historical Society has developed Heritage Village on approximately 143 acres of land on the west side of Mackinaw City. Visitors can enjoy easy walks, nature trails, historic buildings, a covered pavilion, audio

interpretations, interpretive signs, and most importantly, tranquillity.

Heritage Village has buildings from 1880 through 1917, a time of unparalleled changes in lighting, transportation, communication, housing, health care and nearly every other aspect of Straits-area living. The grounds are open year-round during daylight hours.

Also, the Mackinaw Area Historical Society offers lively local monthly programs featuring informative presentations on historically significant topics.
